In order to have a healthy and well colored lawn, proper nutrition and nutrient levels are vital. Going into spring I encourage everyone to look at taking a few core soil samples to see where your nutrient levels lie. This can usually be done for very little, even free by your local extension service. Something as simple as a little Potassium could be keeping your prized lawn you've always dreamed of.
